The Star Trek: Armada timeline is still in development and a timeline update was made by the developers with the 1.4 patch released on April 20, 2014. In November 2012, Michael Stackpole announced that Pocketwatch Games had successfully acquired the rights to the game and the future development of the Star Trek universe. In July 2014, Star Trek: Armada was re-released on Steam through the Humble Bundle. Gameplay The game is an attempt to immerse the player in the universe of Star

Trek, and within this universe, to recreate its style and feel, based around a real-time strategy game engine. Armada also contains many Star Trek (the TV show) references, ranging from the main plot to the ships and weapons. In the game, the player commands a Klingon Battle Cruiser, Starfleet Dreadnought, Romulan Warbird, or Federation Victory class starship. The player can select the level of difficulty (Easy, Normal, or Hard). Armada also features a mission editor where the player can design a game and have the computer play it. There is a campaign mode, where the player commands a fleet and plays through a series of missions. A skirmish mode is also available, where the player can play against the computer. In the skirmish, the player can also create custom scenarios. In the mission editor, the player can also create custom star systems to play with. They can have many different types of star systems such as inhabited systems, stations, planets, and space stations. Players can play with 3 computer-controlled player ships, called "allies".

Development The game was developed by Activision, and was inspired by the real-time strategy games Warcraft, Starcraft, and Civilization. The game was the first Star Trek game for the PlayStation, and also the first 3D game of the franchise. According to Robert Wolfe, who worked on Armada development:

Reception The game received "mixed" reviews on all platforms according to the review aggregation website Metacritic. The Fourms, a public forum website run by fans of the Star Trek universe, were used to discuss the game.
